2017 WYOMING LEGISLATURE GENERAL SESSION WEEK FOUR SUMMARY – FEBRUARY 3, 2017



While this week was full of late nights and long agendas, it also brought some level of relief on Friday when bills faced a deadline to pass Committee of the Whole (first reading of a bill). Several bad bills died – one that would have impacted all of us, the broad-based increase on property tax assessment rates. This bill would have increased taxes on industrial property as well as residential properties. Please see the list below for college-related bills that died.

Now we see bills passing one house and moving to the other side. Next week both houses will take up the budget bill. Usually they present the budget on Monday – members of the Appropriations Committee walk the body through each of the agencies and give a summary of the testimony and their reasoning for any committee actions. The supplemental budget bill is now available on the LSO website – <u>click her to reference HB1 or SF1</u>. Each house begins with mirror bill and the bodies respectively adopt amendments on both second and third readings. They then go to conference committee and the Governor signs the budget.

Recall, the Joint Appropriations Committee added \$631,250 for the veterans' tuition reimbursements (as per the Governor's recommendations) to the Wyoming Community College Commission budget, but also cut the community college block grant by \$590,902. This amount is reflective of the positions and/or program reductions as provided for in Section 320 "Position Freeze and Statewide Budget Reduction" to which other state agencies are subject. The University of Wyoming has a similar reduction in the amount of \$1.04 million.

BILLS OF INTEREST THIS WEEK

- <u>HB 233 State or school employment contract compensation reduction</u> **Dr. Leach testified** in the House Minerals Committee where the bill was laid back, which means it dies.
- <u>HB 292 Community colleges administrative procedure act exclusion</u> **the bill was not considered by the committee.**
- HB 283 Higher education student recruitment planning WACCT testified to say that the
 colleges stand ready to work with UW on recruitment efforts for the state, but that a bill may
 not be needed. Ultimately, the bill failed in the House Education Committee.
- <u>SF 152 Hathaway student scholarships</u> the bill repeals the provisional level of the Hathaway scholarship and creates a savings account students may access as they complete their Hathaway curriculum. The bill was laid back on 2nd reading in the Senate.
