











The eight **Wyoming Community Colleges** and the **Wyoming Community College Commission** (WCCC) are a creation of the Wyoming legislature per the Wyoming Constitution Article 7.

WCCC's Mission and Purpose are to provide coordination, advocacy, funding, and accountability for the Community College System on behalf of the State of Wyoming. Their actions include the distribution of legislative appropriations. Approximately 97% of WCCC's budget goes to the colleges' programs, services, campus operations, library funding, and Wyoming public television. 
The **Wyoming Association of Community College Trustees** (WACCT) acts on behalf of Wyoming's community colleges with representatives from the governing board of every college.

Our actions include lobbying for appropriate, non-volatile funding sources for Wyoming's community colleges in front of the legislature, inciting action that shapes policy, hosting and promoting accessible information, and promoting the quality and vitality of community colleges.

POINTS OF INTEREST

New Visual Arts Building

A new state-of-the-art visual arts building opened in the fall of 2022. Expanded classroom and creative spaces and updated equipment and technology provide students a state-of-the-art and safe learning environment. Programs include ceramics, drawing and painting, art history, museum studies, art education, metalsmithing, printmaking, sculpture, graphic design, and photography.

Military Friendly

Casper College is the most military friendly small community college for 2022-2023. Military Friendly honors those colleges, universities, and trade schools that are doing the most to embrace America's military service members, veterans, and spouses as students and ensure their success on campus. Casper College is a Yellow Ribbon Program School, offers Peer Advisors for Veterans Education (PAVE), has a Student Veterans Club, and recently joined the Got Your 6 Network, part of the Bob Woodruff Foundation, which allows veterans to reach out to other veterans via text message.

Hospitality & Tourism

Casper College programs for training and education in the growing hospitality and tourism industry. More than \$500,000 in funding through the Wyoming Innovation Partnership will support the hospitality and tourism industry's education and workforce training needs, impacting students from middle school through higher education, employees working in tourism-based roles, and the community at-large. The funds are earmarked for integrating graphic design within the marketing, hospitality, and tourism programs, training programs for search and rescue, and establishing space devoted to training for the hospitality and tourism industry. Funding for credit and non-credit training and the hospitality and training space are made possible by a sub-award and partnership from the University of Wyoming's Wyoming Outdoor Recreation Tourism and Hospitality (WORTH) Center.

Medical Laboratory Partners with Sublette County

Casper College's medical laboratory program's unique partnership with the Sublette County Hospital District will address the MLT shortage. The challenges currently facing medical laboratories include a high demand for more qualified graduates, training students from rural and underserved communities, and providing a route for laboratorians to advance in the workforce. For these reasons, the Sublette County Hospital District, in Pinedale and Big Piney, and Casper College have come up with a unique approach to address the MLT shortage: Casper College provides the didactic content and clinical staff at the Pinedale Clinic are facilitating the student laboratory sessions onsite at the clinic. Casper College's program is the only available program in the state and is accredited through the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences. The college works in partnership with the University of Wyoming to give students a streamlined educational pathway towards a bachelor's degree.

CENTRAL WYOMING COLLEGE



Founded in 1966

Central Wyoming College's mission is to transform lives and strengthen communities through learning, leadership, and connection. The college includes a main campus in Riverton, both an outreach center and the Alpine Science Institute in Lander, as well as outreach centers in Jackson and Dubois. CWC is a designated Native American Serving Non-Tribal Institution (NASNTI), and serves the largest American Indian student population in the state of Wyoming.

CWC-Wind River supports American Indian students in their enrollment, achievement, and success at Central Wyoming College! Our goal is to help students start or continue their education close to home in a warm and welcoming environment.

Advocacy

Central Wyoming advocates for Native American student-athletes. Surrounded by the Wind River Reservation, which is home to the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapaho tribes, CWC recognizes the relationship between sports and education for Native Americans. CWC, a federally recognized NASNTI, has athletic teams visit reservation schools to encourage kids to attend college, and requires all staff to participate in training about tribal history, culture, politics, and economics for Wind River.

Nursing

CWC'S Nursing Program is #1 among all colleges in Wyoming, scoring a 92.09 on RegisteredNursing.org. With an experienced nursing faculty and our quality hands-on, team-based, active learning models, our students practice real-world medicine in a state-of-the-art simulation laboratory and become skilled at patient care through clinicals at neighboring facilities.

BAS Offerings

We have a robust portfolio of Bachelor of Applied Science offerings for students with a variety of interests, from Outdoor Program, Law Enforcement, Tribal, and Business & Entrepreneurial Leadership to Early Childhood Education.

Farmer Training Program

We want to help aspiring and beginning farmers grow nutritious foods by developing financially and environmentally sustainable farm businesses in central Wyoming. Our goal is to expand employment and business opportunities in agriculture while also providing our communities with affordable, sustainable foods.

Career Services

CWC's Career Services office guides student career development, which can include student employment, internships, job shadowing, and mentorship/informational interviewing. Career Coaches provide career assessments and we can as assist students with resumes, cover letters, and interviewing techniques. The SkillsMatch website can identify current/learned skill sets and match those skills to job openings in the state. It can even help you find programs for skills you would like to learn.

Eastern Wyoming College got its start in 1948 serving Goshen, Platte, Niobrara, Converse, Weston, and Crook counties. POINTS OF INTEREST

Precision Agriculture

This program is offered through Eastern Wyoming College Department of Agriculture. It is an approach to farm management using information technology to make sure crops and soil receive what they need for the best health and productivity. This includes using drones, GPS, yield maps, soil sampling, and more to create a management system of crops down to a square yard precision, or even individual plants. The classes can be used to transfer into a four-year program, or a student can earn a certificate.

Veterinary Technology

If you love animals, want to learn about animal medicine and are looking for a rewarding and meaningful career, Eastern Wyoming College's Veterinary Technology Program is a great fit. It's the only Veterinary Technology program in the area where students can earn an Associate of Applied Science Degree or a Veterinary Aide certificate.

Gunsmithing

On Eastern Wyoming College's Douglas Campus students can learn how to build and repair guns through the state's only Gunsmithing program. Led by EWC's Glen Morovits, the program will prepare students to make, reproduce, maintain, and modify firearms according to blueprints or custom specifications using specialized hand tools and machines. The program provides students hands-on training and skills to gain employment as a gunsmith.



GILLETTE COLLEGE



Founded in 2021

Gillette College's close-knit campus is designed for students to make lifelong connections and invest in their future. With an average class size of 14, students don't get lost in the shuffle when faculty knows them by their first names; no one is just a face in the crowd. Faculty and staff have strong ties with employers across the region, helping many students receive job offers before they even graduate. Upon graduation, armed with a valuable education, most students enter the workforce with little to no debt, further setting them up for a successful future.

While GCCD pursues accreditation, it will continue a 53year history and partnership with the Northern Wyoming Community College District to offer accredited degrees and certificates to students.

Virtual Reality

A 24-seat state-of-the-art virtual reality lab is at the forefront of several mine training programs housed out of the Gillette College Technical Education Center. Partnerships have been forged with the local industry to provide one-of-a-kind mine safety training specific to each mine. Visitors and local history buffs can also see the virtual reality programming at the local history museum, the Rockpile Museum, which is showcasing a local mine tour, all through the help of their virtual reality goggles. The possibilities are endless with this incredible technology.

Veterans

No matter what program of study our student veterans choose, 99% graduate. This is thanks to the incredible work of the Veteran Services Center and the incredible support Gillette College has for veterans. Gillette College is also home to The American Legion, Post 307 – the only American Legion Post of its kind. Founded at the Gillette Campus, Post 307 is a student organization that provides our student veterans with referrals, support, training, and networks to enhance and develop their student and career opportunities and gives them a voice within their local, state, and national governments.

Nursing

The Gillette College nursing program boasts an impressive employment rate upon graduation for nursing students, at almost 100%. The local hospital partnerships allow for a nearly seamless transition into the workforce, as well as many other clinical partnerships locally. Students receive hands-on training in our advanced, high-tech simulation centers and complete extensive clinical training at healthcare facilities around the region. Through our partnership with the University of Wyoming, students also have the option to take courses toward a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing and have access to individual advising sessions with a trained RN/BSN Completion Advisor.

Academic Pathways

LCCC has adopted the Guided Pathways model to provide our students with clear, structured educational experiences that are designed to lead to high-quality postsecondary credentials and careers. At LCCC there are eight academic Pathways: Agriculture & Equine; Business & Accounting; Communications & Creative Arts; Heath Sciences & Wellness; Human & Public Service; Information Technology; Science, Technology, Engineering & Math (STEM); and Trades & Technical Studies.

Healthcare Programs

We are a pacesetter for healthcare programs, offering 13 unique programs for students in our Health Sciences & Wellness Pathway, including a bachelor's degree in Healthcare Administration. Most recently, LCCC has added Echocardiography to its Sonography Program, the only one in Wyoming, and will be launching a Respiratory Therapy Program in the fall of 2024 to help meet the growing need for industry professionals.

Location

LCCC is located at the crossroads of I-80 and I-25, providing students exposure to a variety of employers and career opportunities in Wyoming and along the Front Range. At LCCC, we work to provide our students with immersion and applied learning experiences. Having access to a variety of industry and community partners allows our students to have hands-on learning experiences while they pursue their degree.

Business Savvy

Northwest College will be graduating the first cohort of our Bachelor of Applied Science in Professional Studies in May 2023. But bringing business savvy to the Big Horn Basin goes beyond associate and bachelor's degree programs through our newest partnership with IMPACT Park County. An expansion of the IMPACT 307's Business Incubator Program, Northwest College will be hosting Business Bootcamp: Entrepreneur 101 events to help community members who are interested in starting a business scope out and assess business ideas, as well as ways to help grow and develop current businesses.

Conservation Law

Northwest College offers the only Conservation Law Enforcement degree in the state, which provides a comprehensive background in criminal justice, environmental law, backcountry survival, and wildlife/natural resource protection. We recently received approval from the WCCC to offer a Bachelor of Applied Science in Criminal Justice, pending accreditation from the Higher Learning Commission. Our Criminal Justice facilities include a VirTra 300-degree firearms simulator, a mock jail cell, and a mock forensic lab to facilitate handson experiences.

Workforce Training

To support economic activity through education and training, in partnership with community and business needs, Northwest College offers custom workforce training programs and access to electrical, HVAC and plumbing apprenticeships. Our CDL training program includes online instruction, in-depth classroom instruction, hours of safety training on our mobile CDL simulator, as well as extensive behind-the-wheel training. A Construction Operator Certification is in development now, with online instruction, virtual simulators, and realworld experience built in.

Advanced Manufacturing



Powerline Program

In the fall of 2022, Western launched the only Powerline program in Wyoming. Course material and lab activities are based around the application and theory of distribution and transmission of electrical power. Employment opportunities are available with rural electric cooperatives, municipal and private utility companies, private contractors, and many others.

Higher Learning Commission Affirmed

Western's 10-year reaffirmation, through the Higher Learning Commission, occurred on November 7 and 8 of 2022 and included a 30,000-word document with over 500 pieces of evidence submitted.

Travel & Tourism

To support southwest Wyoming's travel and tourism economy, Western, upon approval, will be launching an Outdoor program in the fall of of 2023.
